

RULES FOR CHILDREN'S QUIZ BOWL

Cincinnati-Dayton-Indianapolis District Conference 2009

Theme: "Cincinnati-Dayton-Indianapolis District: Moving from Effectiveness to Greatness"

1. Children's Quiz Bowl is a question-and-answer game played between two teams of six players each. (A team may be larger than 6 players, but only 6 play at any one time.)
2. Points are scored by correct answers to questions asked by the Moderator.
3. There are three types of questions: First four questions or fill in the blanks in each category are worth 1 point each, the fifth and sixth question of each category are worth 5 points each, and Bonuses are worth 10 points each.
4. Players should be given 3 seconds from the time the Moderator stops reading to request to have the question read a second time. After the Moderator has completed reading the question the player will have 15 seconds to answer the question. The Moderator should allow for a natural pause, but no stalling.
5. If an answer comes after time has been called, it doesn't count.
6. If a player confers with a team-mate on an answer does not count. It is rebounded to the other team.
7. If a player answers without being recognized, the answer does not count. It's the same as a wrong answer.
8. The first response given is the one that counts. Sometimes a player will attempt to give more than one piece of information. The Moderator, NOT the team members makes the decision on whether the response is wrong.
9. If a player gives the wrong answer, the question is turned over to the other team. The Moderator says, "Rebound to the other team." The Moderator does not reread the question, unless the question is turned over because of an interrupt. The other team must answer within 10 seconds.
10. If the Moderator inadvertently gives an answer to a without giving either team a chance to respond, or without turning the question over, he or she takes the next question in the stack and plays it according to the rules. The same is true if an audience member says the answer.
11. Team members may confer for 10 seconds on Bonus Questions, after the question has been read in its entirety. All team members may participate, however if there is a conflict, the Moderator will ask the team captain for the team's official answer.

12. The Moderator asks for the answer at the end of 10 seconds. The Moderator should allow for natural pauses, but not stalling. If the question called for several answers, the sequence of answers should be identified by the responding team.

13. If a score is tied at the end of the regulation time, the tie is broken by asking each team an equal number of questions. The team that gives the greatest number of correct answers wins.

14. Each team is allowed one, one minute time-out per game. Time out is called by the captain, and must be requested either prior to a question. **Yes, a team member may be substituted for another member during this time out.**

15. A draw of the highest number will determine which team receives the first question. Each team will be asked 7 questions from each of the following categories (the seventh question is a Bonus question): History of the CME Church, African-American history, and the CME Jr. Catechism.

16. The Tie-Breaking questions (not supplied) will be taken from the CME Church Jr. Catechism questions #32 through #48. Information to obtain book can be found on the first page of the CME Church Jr. Catechism quiz bowl questions.

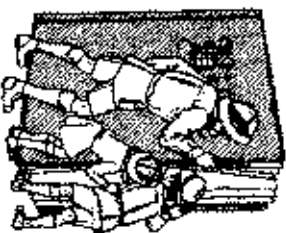

L. GOD

1. **What is the first verse in the Bible?**
"In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth." Gen. 1:1.
2. **Who is God?** God is our Father in heaven, the Creator of all things, and the Giver of every good gift.

"Have we not all one father? Hath not one God created us?" Mal. 2:10.
(Acts 4:24; 1. Cor. 8:6; James 1:17 and Eccl. 12:1)



3. **Where is God?** God is every-
where.

"Can any hide himself in secret places that I shall not see him? saith the Lord. Do not I fill heaven and earth? saith the Lord." Jer. 23:24. (Psa. 139:7-10)

4. **What does God know?** God knows all things, even the thoughts of our hearts.

"Thou knowest my downsitting and mine uprising, thou understandest my thought afar off." Psalms 139:2. (Prov. 15:3; Ezek. 11:5 and John 21:17)



5. **What can God do?** God can do whatever He wills to do.

"I am the Lord, the God of all flesh; is there anything too hard for me? Jer. 32:27. (Matt. 22:29; Rom. 4:21 and Dan. 4:35)

6. **How long has God lived?** God has lived always, and will live forever.

"Before the mountains were brought forth, or even thou hadst formed the earth and the World, even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God. Psalms 90:2. (Isa. 44:6 and Rev. 1:8)



7. **Is God good?** God is holy, just and good.

"The Lord passed by before him and proclaimed, The Lord, the Lord God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering

and abundant in goodness and truth." Exodus 34:6. (Psa. 145:9, 17 and Rev. 34:6)

8. **Does God love us? Yes; God loves everybody, for "God is love."**

"Yes, I have loved thee with an everlasting love." Jer. 31:3. (Rom. 5:8; John 17:23 and 1 John 4:10)

9. **Ought we to love God? Yes; we ought to love God, because He first loved us.**

"We love Him, because He first loved us." 1 John 4:19. Deut. 6:5, Josh. 23:11 and 2 John 6)



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10. **Is there but one God? There is but one living and true God.**

"That all the people of the earth may know that the Lord is God, and that there is none else, 1 Kings 8:60. (2 Kings 19:19; Is. 42:8 and 1 Cor. 8:5-6)



11. **How does God make Himself known to us in the Bible? God makes Himself known to us in the Bible as the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.**

"But the Comforter, which is the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, He shall teach you all things. John 14:26 (2 Cor. 13:14 and Phil. 2:6)

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12. In what name are Christians baptized? Christians are baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Matt. 28:19



ILL MAN

13. Who were our first parents? Adam and Eve were our first parents.
*And Adam called his wife's name Eve, because she was the mother of all living. Gen. 3:20 (Acts 17:26)
14. Where did God place our first parents? God placed them in the Garden of Eden. (Gen. 2:8)

15. Were they created good? They were created good; for God made them in His own image.

*So God created man in His own image. * Gen. 1:27 (Gen. 1:31, Eccl. 7:29 and Isa. 43:7)

16. What were they given to do? They were to care for the garden and to enjoy its fruits. (Gen. 2:15-16)

17. What were they forbidden to do? They were forbidden to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil. (Gen. 2:17)



18. Did they obey God? No; they sinned against God by eating the forbidden fruit. (Gen. 3:6)

19. **What is sin?** Sin is any act, word or purpose in which we disobey God, or any failure to keep His law of love.

"Sin is the transgression of the law." I John 3:4. (Rom. 13:10 and James 4:17)

20. **What evil did sin bring upon our first parents?** They lost the favor of God, were driven out of Eden and became subject to pain and death. (Gen 3:24)



21. **What evil did their fall bring upon all men?** By their fall sin entered into the world and death by sin.

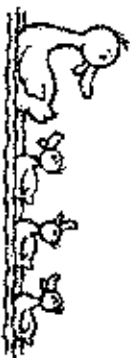
"By one man sin entered into the world and death by sin." Rom. 5:12 (Rom. 5:18; 6:23 and I Cor. 15:22)

III. JESUS CHRIST

22. **What did God do to save fallen man?** "God so loved the world, that He gave His only

begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3:16

23. **What did the Son of God do to save sinners?** To save sinners, Jesus Christ, the Son of God, became man, lived, suffered, died and rose again from the dead. (John 1:14; I Cor. 15:3, 4 and Gal. 4:4)

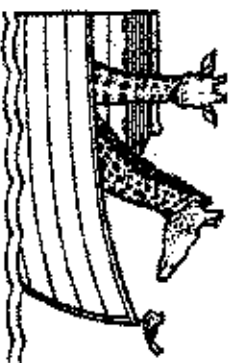


24. **How did He become man?** The Son of God became man by taking upon Him a human body and soul, being born of the Virgin Mary.

*Concerning His Son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh. Rom. 1:3.

25. **Where was He born? He was born in Bethlehem of Judea.** (Micah 5:2; Matt. 2:1 and Luke 2:11)

26. **Who first told the good news of His birth? The angel of the Lord told shepherds the good news of His birth.** (Luke 2:8-12)



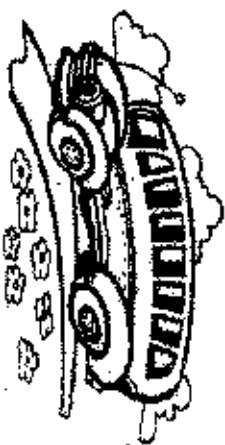
27. **What did the shepherds do? They went quickly to Bethlehem and found the babe lying in a manger.** (Luke 2:15-16)

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28. **Did others come to see the young child? Wise men from the East came and worshipped Him, bringing gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.** (Matt. 2:1, 2, 11)

29. **Where was the Child first taken? He was first taken to the temple of Jerusalem and was there presented to God.** (Luke 2:22)

30. **What name was given to Him? They called His name Jesus.** (Matt. 1:25)



31. **Why was this name chosen? Because God had said: "Thou shalt call His name JESUS: for He shall save His people from their sins."** (Matt. 1:21)

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32. **What does the name Jesus mean?**
The name Jesus means Saviour.

33. **By what other name was He called?**
The angel that spoke to the shepherds called Him, "Christ, the Lord, Luke 2:11.

34. **What does the name Christ mean?**
The name Christ means "The Anointed One." (Luke 4:18; and Acts 10:38)

35. **On what day do we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ? We celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ on Christmas Day.**

36. **Who sought to kill the young child Jesus? King Herod sought to kill Him, but He was taken to Egypt for safety. (Matt. 2:13-14)**



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37. **Where did Jesus live after Herod's death? After Herod's death He was brought back from Egypt and lived in Nazareth. (Matt. 2:23 and Luke 2:39)**

38. **Where was He taken when twelve years old? When twelve years old He was taken to the feast at Jerusalem. (Luke 2:42)**

39. **When His parents missed Him on their way home, where did they find Him? They turned back to Jerusalem and found Him in the temple with the teachers asking and answering questions. (Luke 2:43-47)**

40. **What is told about the youth of Jesus at Nazareth? Jesus was subject unto His parents, and grew in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and men. (Luke 2:40, 51-52)**



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41. When did Jesus begin His ministry? He began His ministry when He was about thirty years old. (Luke 3:23)

42. How did Jesus begin His ministry? He went to John the Baptist, at the river Jordan, and was baptized by him. (Matt. 3:13 and Luke 3:21)

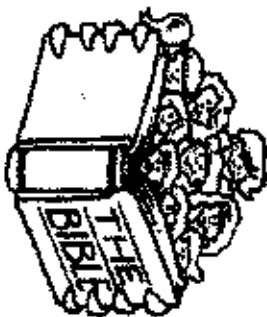
43. What took place when Jesus was baptized? The Holy Spirit came upon Him like a dove, and a voice from heaven said, "This is my beloved Son." Matt. 3:16-17.

44. What did John the Baptist say of Jesus? John the Baptist said, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." John 1:29.



45. What did Jesus do after His baptism? He went into the wilderness and fasted forty days and forty nights. (Matt. 4:1-2)

46. What else took place in the wilderness? Jesus was tempted by the devil. (Matt. 4:3-11)



47. How did He overcome the tempter? Jesus overcame the tempter by the word of God. (Luke 4:4, 8, 12)

48. What did Jesus do after the temptation? He began preaching the gospel of the Kingdom, in Galilee and Judea. (Matt. 4:17 and Mark 1:14-15)
